INTO THE WILDERNESS



The season of lent reminds us that for the Christian the discipline of the wilderness is never far away. Whether we are 'led by the Spirit into the wilderness' (Matthew Ch 4:1) as the Lord prompts us and invites us to take on some form of fasting, that is fasting from food or fasting from something else that brings comfort. Or whether through circumstances beyond our control we are 'sent... out into the wilderness' (Mark 1: 12) where, for example, we may have to carry a burden unique to our own lives and it will often be the case that we don't know how long this will last for.

Either way we find ourselves in the wilderness. This is a place in between the joy of us knowing that we are His child, 'You are My Son (my child), whom I love, with You I am well pleased' (Mark 1:11) and us being sent out 'into Galilee, proclaiming the good news of God' (Mark 1: 14). The wilderness is a season where the gift of being His child is cast in stone so that in due time we are ready to launch out into whatever purpose the Lord has for our lives.

Naturally we will shy away from the wilderness, but may we learn to embrace it for within it and beyond it lies great joy. Paul said 'therefore I will boast all the more gladly about my weaknesses so that Christ's power may rest on me' (2 Corinthians 12:9). And because the wilderness is a gift let us be careful that we don't seek to line it with feathers, by trying to turn the hard stone into bread (Matthew 4:3) or to be careless about looking after ourselves physically or spiritually (Matthew 4:6) or to say I'm a celebrity get me out of here and give me my due reward now (Matthew 4:9). Often it is only as we walk out of the wilderness that we realise what the Lord has done as He has both strengthened our identity in Him and wonderfully prepared us for all that He is calling us to BE and DO.
