The Priority of Mission

As you will know we have just emerged from a week of Mission which took place across the Parish from Saturday 29th April to Sunday 7th May. The first mission we have done for many years. Before sharing the wonderful fruits of this mission I want to ask ourselves a question: why is mission important?

Mission is not only important it is the very breath of life for individual Christians and for God's church. The apostle Paul said 'however I consider my life worth nothing to me, my only aim is to finish the race and complete the task the Lord Jesus has given me, the task of testifying to the good news of God's grace' (Acts 20: 24) and he also said 'for I am not ashamed of the gospel, because it is the power of God that brings salvation to everyone who believes...' (Romans 1: 16). God does the saving of souls, rescuing them from the prospect of eternal separation from His love, but we do the sharing, often with stumbling words as we explain that there is an awesome, holy and loving Father and that our way back to being intimately connected to His care and love is through our confession of mortal weakness or sin as we accept that Jesus has died in our place that we might live in His place and as we activate all of this by asking Jesus to forgive us and live in our hearts!

And the wonderful fruits...

- 1) A new clarity and confidence in the gospel message and an accompanying zeal to share Jesus with our community at every opportunity.
- 2) We have already seen a number of folk connect with our churches, some as a direct result of the mission others as God has honoured our stepping out.
- 3) We got to share together doing 'kingdom work' (God's work that is beyond just day to day concerns of our churches) with our wonderful brothers and sisters in the TFM team.
- 4) We have strengthened our bonds of partnership across the churches in the Parish.
- 5) Last but not least we have both attracted the attention of our Father as we have stepped out in obedience, which has led to the soil being softened enabling the seed to germinate and we have seen the ongoing need for well-directed and fervent prayer!

As you will know, the editor has recently come back from visiting family in Australia, while we were there we went to the cinema to see a newly released Christian film called "Jesus Revolution". We didn't know what the film was about but we were deeply moved by its content which spoke to us about how we as churches should welcome everyone. I would highly recommend you going to see it when it is released in the UK on 23rd June.

"It is the true story of a national spiritual awakening in the USA in the early 1970s and its origins within a community of teenage hippies in Southern California.

In the 1970s, a young Greg Laurie (Joel Courtney) is searching for all the right things in all the wrong places: until he meets Lonnie Frisbee (Jonathan Roumie), a charismatic hippie-street-preacher. Together with Pastor Chuck Smith (Kelsey Grammer), they open the doors of Smith's languishing church to an unexpected revival of radical and new found love, leading to what TIME Magazine dubbed a Jesus Revolution."

Book reviews - have you read any books recently? Why not tell everyone about them? Especially any christian books which have meant a lot to you. As you already know, the editor has recently been on a few long journeys and has therefore had some time for reading. I have nearly finished two books, both of which I would highly recommend to you:



1 - We've Never Been This Way Before: Trusting God in Unprecedented Times by Best-Selling Author R.T. Kendall - For me this book says it is not enoughto know about God, we need to know God Himself.

R.T. Kendall says - "what if I told you the "new normal" is that nothing will be normal again? Recent events across, not only America but the entire world have brought us to the precipice of the most challenging moments of our lifetimes. But while these times seem unprecedented and unchartered to us, they are not to God. Much like He said to Joshua and the children of Israel standing on the edge of the Promised Land, God now says to us: "You have never been this way before" (Josh.3:4). God's word is tender, challenging, and scary. God knows where we've been and where we are going. As we cope with extraordinary new outbreaks of disease, racism, and cultural upheaval, we have been forced to recognise that we are not prepared for this. Nobody is."

Although the book is written from a perspective of events in America, it has so much to say to me and you about our current situation, it has spoken a lot to me. R. T. Kendall helps us navigate the way forward by exploring how God led His people in the past, he helps us understand what God is saying to us during this time of uncertainty and change.

2 - Eternity is Now: A radical rediscovery of what Jesus really taught about Salvation, Eternity and getting to the Good Place, by John Ortberg - for me this book shows what Jesus Gospel message was, about the availability of the Kingdom here and now, God's Kingdom here on Earth. Jesus was the Kingdom bringer, enabling us to become conduits of God's power, joy and love to a broken world. Jesus preached 'The Kingdom of God has come near - repent and believe the Good News'. It is not just about news but Good News!


